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Higher Education institutes are valuing the teaching of their staff as an important standard in quality of their programs and thus an important aspect in accreditation. Professional development programs are therefore offered at the university to ensure the professional growth of these staff. The question for both, the universities and the accreditation agencies, remain on how to determine if these PD programs increase the quality of teaching staff. The pedagogical content knowledge (PCK) is a framework that can be used to assess and determine the professional growth in teachers' knowledge and competencies.

Measuring the PCK informs universities and accreditation agencies about the quality of the teaching staff who are largely responsible for the quality of their programs. In this pre-conference workshop of CANQATE 2022, participants will explore how this model can be used as a quality standard to assess and determine the professional development of faculty.

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
